## KAYSERİ UNIVERSITY

Founded in 2018, Kayseri University has six faculties, 13 vocational schools, and one graduate education institute.

The main campus of Kayseri University is the 15 Temmuz Campus, located in the Talas District. Kayseri University has 15,375 students, with 283 academic and 379 administrative staff members.

## MINOR AND DOUBLE MAJOR OPPORTUNITIES

### What is a Minor?

A minor is a program that allows academically successful undergraduate students to earn a certificate by completing a limited number of courses in a second program related to their main field of study.

### What is a Double Major?

A double major is a program that enables academically successful students in an associate or bachelor's degree program to earn two diplomas by completing the required courses in both their primary and secondary fields of study.

For example, a psychology major can earn a diploma in sociology, or a business administration major can obtain a diploma in economics by completing the required courses in both programs.

### Intra-institutional Transfer:

A student enrolled at Kayseri University can transfer to an equivalent diploma program within the same or a different unit of the university, subject to quotas and conditions.

### Inter-institutional Transfer:

Inter-institutional transfer is realized between equivalent diploma programs of higher education institutions at the same level within the framework of the quotas and conditions published by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK).

### Lateral Transfer According to Additional Article-1:

This applies to associate and undergraduate programs at Kayseri University. The student's central placement score must be equal to or higher than the base score of the program to which the student wants to transfer.

### Admission by Vertical Transfer

Students who complete a two-year associate degree program can transfer to a four-year undergraduate program by taking the Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS).



## STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

### International Cooperations Office

The International Cooperations Office of Kayseri University, founded in 2018, was established to manage the university's internationalization process.

The Office carries out the following activities;

- Identifying, reviewing and implementing internationalization strategies and policies of the University.
- Carrying out cooperation activities with higher education institutions and other organizations abroad.
- Conducting business and transactions related to Exchange Programs within the framework of agreements / protocols.
- Carrying out work and procedures related to the exchange of students, academics, and administrative staff with universities, units affiliated with universities, research centers, and similar institutions.

e) Contributing to joint training programs, projects, and scientific activities with universities abroad, university-affiliated units, research centers, and similar institutions.

f) Supporting our university's collaboration with global universities and educational research institutions and transmitting project calls and announcements related to national/international exchange programs for students and staff.

g) Contributing to the preparation of all required procedures and guidelines for exchange programs and international collaborations.

The Erasmus, Farabi, and Mevlana Institutional Coordinatorships operate within the International Cooperations Office. Additionally, the office collaborates with the International Student Coordinatorship to assist international students in their application process and adaptation to university life.

## 1. Erasmus Institutional Coordinatorship

Erasmus+ is a grant program of the European Union covering the fields of education, youth and sport, implemented between 2021-2027. The Erasmus+ Program aims to equip individuals with new skills, enhance their personal development, and improve their employment opportunities, regardless of age or educational background.

The activities supported under the Erasmus+ Program are categorized into three Key Actions (KA):

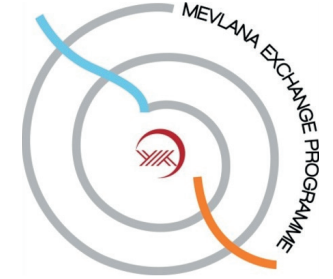

## 2. Farabi Institutional Coordinatorship

The Farabi Exchange Program is a student and faculty exchange program between higher education institutions that offer associate, undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral education at universities and institutes of high technology. The Farabi Exchange Program allows students and faculty members to continue their education and academic activities at another higher education institution for one or two semesters. Students in the Farabi Exchange Program receive scholarships, while faculty members receive additionally course payments. The principles regarding the implementation of the Farabi Exchange Program are detailed in the Regulation and Principles and Procedures.

## 3. Mevlana Institutional Coordinatorship

The program facilitates the exchange of students and academic staff between Turkish higher education institutions and institutions in other countries. Following the regulation published on August 23, 2011 (No: 28034), student and academic staff exchanges between Turkish higher education institutions and institutions abroad became possible. Unlike other exchange programs, this program allows mobility to higher education institutions worldwide without geographical restrictions.

Students can participate in the exchange program for a minimum of one and a maximum of two semesters, while faculty members can take part for a minimum of one week and a maximum of three months to give lectures at higher education institutions worldwide. Similarly, students and faculty members from all regions of the world can come to higher education institutions in Türkiye.

### LANGUAGE TEACHING APPLICATION AND RESEARCH CENTER (DİLMER)

DİLMER was officially established on January 19, 2022, and began offering education and training. Foreign students admitted to Kayseri University receive 900 hours of Turkish language education over two semesters. Successful students are awarded Turkish Proficiency Certificates and placed into their respective departments. DİLMER's training programs are conducted by expert educators in their respective fields. Student-centered approaches are emphasized in Turkish language instruction, and teaching practices adhere to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).



### LIFE ON CAMPUS

The Department of Health, Culture, and Sports oversees activities related to students' social and cultural life at the university. Kayseri University provides students with opportunities to develop culturally, artistically and athletically while receiving a high level of professional education. Additionally, the unit organizes student clubs, youth week events, and sports activities.

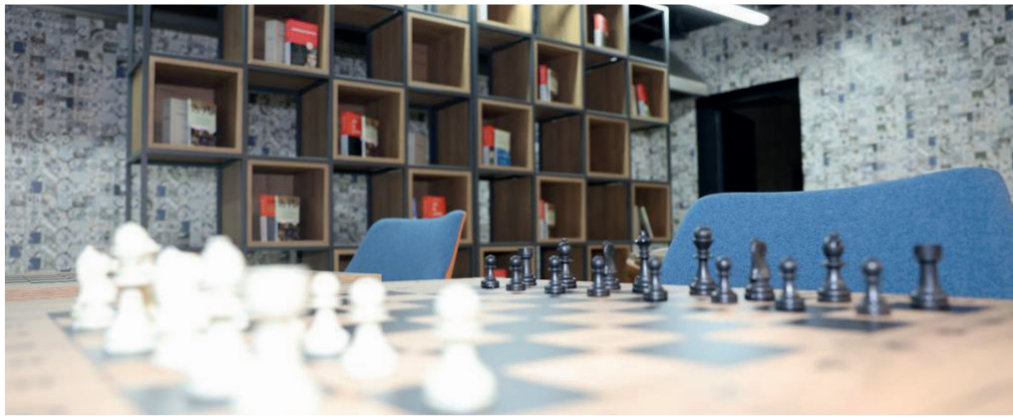


features an indoor sports hall, a fitness center, an outdoor astroturf, an outdoor basketball court, an outdoor tennis court, and a volleyball court.

Food services at Kayseri University are managed by the Social Enterprises and Cafeterias Branch Directorate, providing students with two meals daily lunch and dinner.

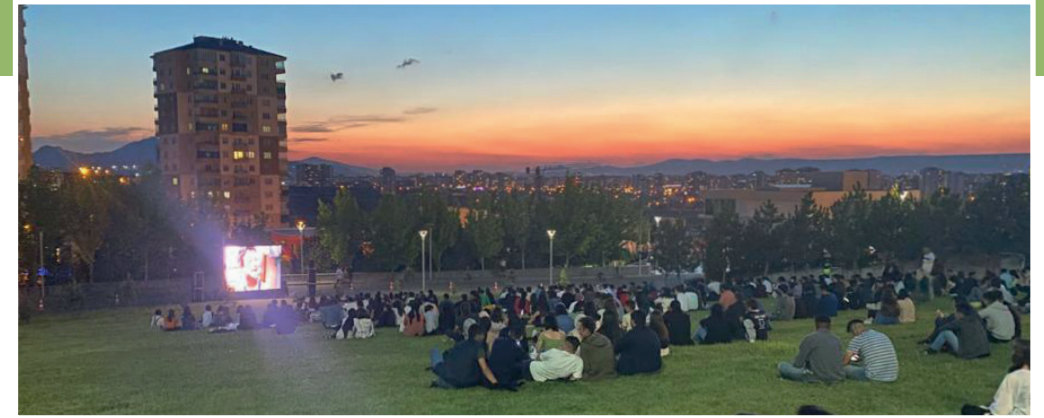
### **Psychological Counseling Unit**
